- o Fiscal Year '24 Update:
  - Fundraising
    - 125th Anniversary Campaign \$42,639,762 raised to date (\$125M total goal, \$75M FY23-25)
    - 477 more donors needed to reach 8.2% alumnae/i participation goal this FY (ends 6/30)
  - Communications
    - 210 emails sent; 48% open rate (35% edu. industry avg.)
    - Simmons Network 5.6K users, 719 new, 67% alums, 59% will help

- Volunteerism 64 active reunion volunteers (representing 15 classes)
- Experiential/Events
  - May 31 June 2: Jubilee Reunion (1947-1974): 100 in-person registered, 30 virtual (150 goal)

  - Our Vanguard Investment account (7.8% rate of return) has: \$130,869.51
  - Our TD Bank checking account (before the Awards checks) has a balance of: \$12,533.08
  - Our expenses include: Board Activities; funding for DEI expenses; Student Awards; 50 days to graduation, etc., Google Suites & Wix for our website; Bookkeeping services, etc.
  - Some changes this fiscal year include: Closing the SVB Private account and moving to TD Bank and the Loss of Liberty Mutual income stream
